Full Day Puszta



We take you to the Hungarian Great Plain, the incomparable "Hungarian Puszta" (meaning a wasteland). The second largest national park of Hungary was declared a bio-reserve by UNESCO. Typical farm-life has survived here, in the Kiskunság, as have the ancient domesticated animals and intelligent sheep dog breeds.

Services: during the horse show we have the opportunity to learn about the traditions of the earlier pastoral way of life, animal husbandry in the Puszta. The most spectacular parts of the regular horse show are the stud drive and the breathtaking "Puszta-five" and "Koch-five". We enjoy a traditional carriage riding through the quiet sand-hills and lonely cottages and taste fine Hungarian cuisine and local wines in the Csarda of Puszta.

Meals: typical Hungarian lunch.

Full Day Eger



One of the country's most attractive Baroque cities, a 1000-year-old episcopal seat with a glorious historical past is situated in Northern-Hungary. Eger is a town of medicinal baths and the arch-bishop of the county, and also fine wines. After a walking sight seeing tour of old town with guidance we take a visit the prison of the fortress.

Services: 3 course gourmet meal in the famous Fehér Szarvas restaurant accompanied by Eger wines. We taste wines in the centuries old wine cellars of Eger, the Labyrinth of the town. Eger is the home of the famous Eger Bull Blood red wine.

Meals: lunch with winetasting.



Full Day Balaton



Central Europa's largest lake with its opalescent, yellow-green, silky-smooth water is the most visited resort of Hungary. In summer the water temperature is between 21-26°C.

Services: we visit the Tihany peninsula, the clifftop Abbey Church founded by King Andrew I. After a delicious lunch we have time for swimming or shopping. We driving along the western bank of the lake afternoon, towards Balatonfüred which has a long history as a spa. We can taste its mineral water. After a walk on the promenade under the century old sycamore trees we leave Lake Balaton. Between Budapest and Balaton we visit Velence lake. Vacationers and migratory birds share this lake. On the Bence-hill we enjoy the most beautiful panorama, wines of local cellars and a rustic snack. After this break we return Budapest.

Meals: lunch with wine.

Full Day Szentendre - Visegrád



North of Budapest, the river Danube cuts the mountains. The scene of this dramatic deviation is known as Danube Bend. Here the river is at most alluring, the lush countryside a delight, the towns aglow with charm. We arrive Szentendre, a small Baroque town of Hungarian artists. The town got its unique character from the orthodox colonies in the 15th century. Szentendre has been a home of many famous Hungarian artists. After a promenade through the seven churches' oldtown we visit the country's most popular museum, the Margit Kovacs ceramic collection.

Services: we have a lunch in Visegrad, the former royal settlement from the 13th century a five miles upriver from Szentendre. From the upper castle, the ancient citadel we enjoy the unmatched views of the wide and tree-lined Danube. After a three course venison lunch (with aperitif and red wine) in Nagyvillám Hunting-csarda accompanied by gipsy music we return to Budapest.

Full Day Sightseeing in Budapest



Grand city tour - passing by the Parliament we cross the Danube on the Margaret Bridge (Margaret Island) and drive to the Castle District on the Buda side, where we visit the Fishermen's Bastion (promenade) and the Matthias church (interior visit), the oldtown and the royal castle. After a short cafe break we continue the sight seeing towards the Gellert hill and the Citadel. We cross Elisabeth Bridge and through the inner city we arrive to the Old City Market Hall. We have a three course buffet lunch there. Along the Little Boulevard and the Andrassy Boulevard we pass the Opera. In the City Park we will be stopping and visit the Vajdahunyad Castle and the Heroes square. Passing the elegant Stefania Boulevard and Zuglo, the district of embassies we reach the People's Stadium and its establishments. Along the Rákóczi Street we arrive to the former Jewish quarter. We visit Europa's biggest synagogue and the W. II monument. The tour ends by your hotel.

Services: coffee break.

Full Day Esztergom & Danube Bend



History and charm where the large river swerves: we driving along the scenic valley of Danube (the second largest river of Europe). The first stop will be the catedral city of Esztergom, the very first medieval capital of Hungary, where King Saint Stephen was crowned. We visit the biggest church of Hungary, the great domed Basilica of Esztergom, in its red marble Renaissance chapel and the treasury.

Services: On our way southwards we have a delicious venison-lunch accompanied with Hungarian red wine and gypsy music in Visegrad. From the upper castle of Visegrad, the ancient citadel of Arpad-dynasty and the Angevin kings in the mid-13th century, we enjoy the unmatched views of the wide and tree-lined Danube-valley. We take a short walking sight-seeing tour South of Visegrad in the small Baroque town of Szentendre. The Hungarian artist's town got its unique character from its orthodox colonies in the 15th century. Szentendre has been a home to many famous Hungarian artists at the turn of century. We return to Budapest at 6.00 p.m.

Meals: lunch.



Full Day Wien



There is only 250 km between Budapest and Vienna. The capital of Austria is waiting for visitors with its all splendour and charm. We depart 7.30 from your hotel and arrive at 10.30 a.m. to Vienna. After a guided sight-seeing tour by bus you have 5 hours for walking around on your own in the downtown. Return to Budapest at 5.00 p.m.
